About Amarkantak

Pauranic name of Amarkantak was Rikshaparvat. It is the place of origin of holy Narmada River. Among all the sacred rivers of India, river Narmada occupies a unique place. It is said that Lord Shiva blessed Narmada Ji with unique purifying powers. It is also said that to purify oneself, a devotee requires taking one dip in the Holy Ganga, seven days' prayers on the banks of Yamuna and three days prayers on the banks of Saraswati, but above all the mere sight of Narmada is enough to purify oneself. A charming folk tale describes the superiority of Narmada over Ganga. Once every year, after she herself is polluted beyond tolerance, Ganga visits Narmada dressed like a dark woman and takes a cleansing purifying dip in its waters! Narmada river is more than 150 million years older than the Ganga River and is considered by many Hindus to be the most sacred for all the rivers of India, Amarkantak itself is a sacred pilgrim to the Hindus and is deemed to be a door-way to 'nirwana'.



Amarkantak receives large number of tourists throughout the year. Being a pilgrimage destination, majority of them are Hindu devotees. Apart from being a pilgrimage destination, it is also a popular hill station. So for those who are interested in hill station pilgrim then it is the best option in Central India. Being origin of Holy Narmada river, devotees takes this place with great devotion and respect. While visiting Amarkantak we can see various temples, Kapildhara, Temple of Kalchuri era & Narmada Kund from where river Narmada originates and number of Ashrams. Hindu saints see this place with great respect and visits for meditation and feel the holiness of atmosphere.

About Indira Gandhi National Tribal University (IGNTU)

The Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, Amarkantak has been established by an Act of the Parliament of India. It came into existence by the Indira Gandhi National Tribal University Act, 2007 and came into action on July 2008. The tribal people are rich in cultural heritage and skill of art and craft but they are still marginalized in respect to higher education as well as in other walks of life. Now in the present age of globalization the world has shrunk into a village as the society has advanced in technology. But the tribes, who are the custodians of Indian culture in real sense, are far behind in this race of advancement. In order to rescue them from the present plight, the university has put before itself to provide quality education to the tribal population and wish to benefit the tribes of the nation with high quality research work and quality life.

How to reach Amarkantak?

Amarkantak is situated 30 kms in the west of Pendra Road Railway Station (Chattisgarh) on Katni-Bilaspur track of South West Central Railway. Almost all the trains plying on this track stop here. It can be reached by bus from all directions as there are good frequency of buses on Jabalpur, Raipur, Bilaspur, and Allahabad, Rewa, Shahdol, Dindori and Anuppur routes. Amarkantak can be approached by air through Jabalpur (M.P.) in the West and Raipur (Chattisgarh) in the East.

Nearest Airport

1. Jabalpur - Distance 220 KM from Amarkantak.
2. Raipur - Distance 230 KM from Amarkantak.

Nearest Railway Station

1. Pendra Road - Distance 35 KM from Amarkantak.
2. Anuppur - Distance 50 KM from Amarkantak.
3. Bilaspur - Distance 120 KM from Amarkantak.

Workshop Theme

Skill Development and research development efforts in India requires organized efforts in order to reap the demographic dividend of young population with an average age of below 30.
