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कुलपति का संदेश

भारतीय संसद द्वारा वर्ष 2007 में पारित अधिनियम के द्वारा केन्द्रीय विश्वविद्यालय के रूप में स्थापित इन्दिरा गाँधी राष्ट्रीय जनजातीय विश्वविद्यालय में शिक्षा, संस्कार और कौशल प्राप्त करने के इच्छुक अभ्यर्थियों का स्वागत है।

देश का यह प्रथम जनजातीय विश्वविद्यालय सतपुडा और विन्ध्य पर्वत के संधि स्थल पर विद्यमान मैकल पर्वत शिखर पर सतत प्रवाहित माँ नर्मदा के आँचल की छत्र-छाया में अवस्थित, जोहिला, सोनभद्र और अरंडी नदियों से अकंकृत तथा शाल वन से चतुर्दिक परिवेष्टित भारत की मूल प्राकृतिक परम्परा को सहेज कर रखने वाले आदिवासी समुदाय से निवस्थित क्षेत्र में अवस्थित यह विश्वविद्यालय तथा मणिपुर के सुरम्य वातावरण में स्थित इसका क्षेत्रीय परिसर विश्व में अपने प्रकार का विलक्षण शिक्षा केंद्र है जहाँ पहली कक्षा से लेकर अनुसंधान के स्तर तक ज्ञान-विज्ञान की समस्त विधाओं की सम्यक् शिक्षा देने की व्यवस्था है।

जनजातीय कला, साहित्य, संस्कृति और कौशल का संरक्षण करते हुए उसका आधुनिक ज्ञान के साथ समायोजन करना और उसका लाभ निरन्तर समाज को देना तथा आधुनिक शिक्षा व्यवस्था की उपलब्धियों को इस समाज तक पहुँचाना विश्वविद्यालय का प्रमुख ध्येय है। आदिवासी समुदाय के पास संरक्षित परम्परागत ज्ञान की समृद्ध विरासत को परिरक्षित रखने, उसे संवर्द्धित करने तथा उसे सम्पूर्ण मानवता के हित के लिए प्रयुक्त करने के लिए विश्वविद्यालय के सभी विभागों की पाठ्यचर्या जनजातीय विषय-वस्तु पर संकेंद्रित है एवं शिक्षकों तथा शोधार्थियों के द्वारा आदिवासी परम्परा केंद्रित परियोजनाओं पर अनुसंधान कार्य किया जाता है। अध्ययन, अनुसंधान, नवाचार और ज्ञान-विज्ञान के प्रसार के लिए सुसज्जित कक्षाएँ, अत्याधुनिक उपकरणों से युक्त उन्नत प्रयोगशालाएँ, अखिल भारतीय आदिवासी संग्रहालय, संगणकीय केंद्र और पुस्तकों और ई-संसाधनों से समृद्ध पुस्तकालय परिसर में स्थित हैं।

प्रज्ञावान, सुयोग्य एवं ख्यातिलब्ध शिक्षकों और कार्य के प्रति समर्पित ऊर्जावान अधिकारियों तथा कर्मचारियों के साथ विश्वविद्यालय विषयगत, व्यवहारगत और नीतिगत ज्ञान प्रदान करने में रत है। उच्च गुणवत्ता के प्रकाशनों के साथ ही शिक्षकों द्वारा राष्ट्रीय और अन्तरराष्ट्रीय संगोष्ठियों का आयोजन भी किया जाता है जिनसे विद्यार्थियों को अधुनातन ज्ञान और अनुसन्धान से परिचित होने का अवसर मिलता है। समय-समय पर विद्वानों, विषय-विशेषज्ञों और प्रखर वक्ताओं को आमंत्रित करके विद्या के विस्तृत आयामों से साक्षात्कार का अवसर भी विद्यार्थियों के लिए सुलभ कराया जाता है। शैक्षणिक भ्रमण, औद्योगिक प्रशिक्षण और व्यावसायिक कौशल संवर्द्धन को औपचारिक शिक्षा के साथ समाविष्ट करके विद्यार्थियों को बौद्धिक और क्रियात्मक रूप से सशक्त करने हेतु विश्वविद्यालय कृतसंकल्प है।

अत्याधुनिक सुविधाओं से युक्त खेल-परिसर में बास्केटबाल, फुटबाल, वालीबाल, कबड्डी, खो-खो, लम्बी कूद, दौड़ जैसे मैदानी खेलों के साथ टेबल-टेनिस, शतरंज, कैरम और बैडमिन्टन जैसे कक्षों के अन्दर खेले जाने वाले खेलों की भी समुचित व्यवस्था है। विद्यार्थियों को राष्ट्रीय और अन्तरराष्ट्रीय खेल प्रतियोगिताओं के लिए तैयार करने के साथ-साथ उनके शारीरिक और मानसिक स्वास्थ्य को संवर्द्धित करने के समस्त साधन खेल परिसर में उपलब्ध हैं। सांस्कृतिक कार्यक्रमों और दृश्य-श्रव्य विधाओं का प्रशिक्षण देकर सांस्कृतिक प्रकोष्ठ के माध्यम से पाठ्येतर गतिविधियों को भी बढ़ावा दिया जा रहा है जिससे विद्यार्थियों की गायन, वादन, नृत्य, संगीत और नाट्य की प्रतिभा को निखारकर भविष्य के अवसरों के लिए उन्हें तैयार किया जा सके।

विश्वविद्यालय में गोविन्द गुरु बालक छात्रावास, रानी दुर्गावती बालिका छात्रावास, ओ.बी.सी. छात्रावास और सोन शोध छात्रावास में विद्यार्थियों के लिए आवासीय सुविधा उपलब्ध है। समीपवर्ती क्षेत्रों से अध्ययन हेतु आने वाले विद्यार्थियों के लिए विश्वविद्यालय नगण्य शुल्क पर बस की सुविधा भी उपलब्ध कराता है। बैंक,

About the University

INDIRA GANDHI NATIONAL TRIBAL UNIVERSITY: A PROFILE

Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, Amarkantak was established by an Act of the Parliament of India in 2007. The University started functioning from July 2008. The jurisdiction of the University extends to the whole country and it is fully funded by the Central Government through the University Grants Commission. The University aims to cater the long cherished dream of tribal population for higher education.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The tribal people are rich in terms of heritage culture, art and crafts. But in matters of higher education and policy making they are at the receiving end. In the present age of globalization the world has shrunk into a village as the society has advanced in technology. But the tribes, who are the custodians of Indian culture in the real sense of the term, are far behind in this race of advancement. In order to rescue the tribe from the present plight, the University has set the following aims and objectives to achieve.

- To provide avenues of education, viz a viz especially higher education and research facilities primarily for the tribal population of India.
- To disseminate and advance knowledge by providing instructional and research facilities in tribal art, tradition, culture, language, medicinal systems, customs, forest base economic activities, flora and

 - To take appropriate measures to promote innovations in the teaching learning process in the context of inter-disciplinary studies and researches and to pay special attention to improve social, educational and economic conditions and welfare of the scheduled tribes within the Union of India.

 - ❖ To strengthen facilities for modern scientific research.
 - ❖ To inculcate good values and morale among the University stakeholders for effectiveness, transparency and accountability.
 - ❖ To keep pace with the changing scenario in higher education and research at the National and International levels.
 - ❖ To collaborate with premier institutions for sharing of knowledge.
 - ❖ To foster interdisciplinary education and research.

About Amarkantak

Amarkantak, a famous Hindu Pilgrim town, located in the State of Madhya Pradesh in India at 22.67°N 81.75°E and is also a part of the Achanakmar-Amarkantak Biosphere Reserve, known for rarest endangered herbal plants like Gulbakawali, Brahmi, Patal Kumhda, Vidari Kand, Akarkara, Brahma, Shivlingi, Anantmool, etc., and faunal species including tiger and leopard.

This pilgrim town with approximately 10,000 inhabitants along with tribal villages with tribes prominently Gond, Baiga, Panika, Kol and Agaria in adjoining forest areas, is located in the meeting point between the Vindhya and the Satpura Ranges, with the Mekal Hills being the fulcrum. Situated in the district of Anuppur in Madhya Pradesh, Amarkantak perches the Mekal Mountain that links the Vindhyan and the Satpura ranges. It is about 70 Kms away from the district headquarter. Three important rivers i.e. the Narmada, the Son and the Johila originate from here forming the lifeline of a major part of the country. The place has its religious importance too. How to reach the University

The University Campus is located at a 22 km. distance from Pendra Road Railway Station. There are bus services available at regular intervals and taxi services are available round the clock. The main town of Amarkantak is located at 25 Km distance

How to reach Amarkantak

Amarkantak is situated 30 kms in the West of Pendra Road Railway Station (Chhattisgarh) on Katni-Bilaspur track of South West Central Railway. Almost all the trains plying on this track stop here. It can be reached by bus from all directions as there are good frequency of buses on

cluster of temples that is still intact, of which, Mahendranath and Pataleshwar temples are more important. These temples are protected by the Archaeological Survey of India.

The Narmada temple has been built around the springhead of the river. The temple was built by the Bhonsles of Nagpur. Maharaja Gulab Singh belonging to the Baghela Dynasty of Rewa constructed the outer boundary wall of the temple complex. The geographical set up of Amarkantak has bestowed upon it the everlasting greenery and serene beauty.

This holy place is the abode of Goddess Narmada. This mystic power attracted Adi Shankaracharya and Poet Kabir, spelled bound many spiritual and peace seekers with its solitude and sacredness. There is a perfect match between the significance of Amarkantak, situated at an average elevation of 1048 metres (3438 ft) and the vision, mission and objectives of this National Tribal University.

REGIONAL CAMPUS, MANIPUR

The first Regional Campus of Indira Gandhi National Tribal University was established at Imphal, Manipur in 2009. The campus is spread over 301 acres of land in the green and picturesque location of Makhan village, Kangpokpi District, 25 km from Imphal on Imphal-Dimapur National Highway No 39.

The campus has 06 structures- Administrative building, Faculty building, Library, Classrooms, Guest house, Sport complex and Canteen. Currently, there are four departments viz. - ❑ Mere appearance in the Entrance Test or securing pass marks in the written test does not entitle the candidate to be considered for admission to the course unless he/she fulfils the other eligibility conditions. Applicants must fully satisfy themselves about their eligibility as prescribed above, before filling in the application form. It shall be the full responsibility of the Candidate himself/herself, to thoroughly go through the rules / conditions regarding Eligibility, Age limit, Caste Category, Selection of subject, Choice of Test Centre etc. University shall not entertain any complaint occurring due to negligence / ignorance / carelessness of the candidate at any stage. Such candidature shall be terminated immediately soon after the cognizance of any discrepancy.
- ❑ For an updated list of state-wise OBCs eligible for availing of the benefit of reservation, please visit the list maintained by the National Commission for Backward Classes at its website <http://ncbc.nic.in/backwardclasses/index.html>. You may also access information in respect to the creamy layer at <http://ncbc.nic.in/Creamyayer.html>. In the case of NC-OBC category, the caste should be included in the Central List of NC-OBC by the National Commission of Backward Classes, Government of India. The candidates claiming reservation under this category are required to enclose the certificate in the prescribed format issued by the Competent Authority failing which their claim for the seat under the above quota shall not be considered. Any subsequent changes will not be effective for admission.

- ❑ SC/ST/PWD and Kashmiri Migrant students can avail 5% relaxation in marks either at the qualifying examination or at the entrance examination. The concession cannot be availed at both levels. If the seats reserved for SC/ST remain vacant then the same will be filled by the SC/ST candidates who appear for entrance exam irrespective of their ranking in the exam.
- ❑ Opportunity of admission in any other academic program in the next academic year (shifting of students from one UG/PG programme to another UG/PG programme) only to those students who have withdrawn/cancelled their admission before 31 August in the last academic year.
- ❑ In case of two or more candidates securing equal marks in the qualifying examination/Entrance Test then the admission will be successively given in order of preference as follows:
 - i. Who secures highest marks/CGPA in the qualifying examination.
 - ii. Who obtained highest marks in the relevant subject for which He/She is seeking admission.
 - iii. Who obtained highest marks in previous examinations. (10+2 for UG and 10+2+3 for PG).
 - iv. Who is senior in age
- ❑ Candidates admitted to any course in this University shall not be eligible to pursue simultaneously any other full-time course (unless permitted otherwise) or hold any employment paid in any Institution.
- ❑ Due to paucity of Hostel accommodation, the University cannot guarantee Hostel accommodation to all the students admitted into various programmes. No student admitted to the University can claim the Hostel seat as a matter of right. The hostel will be allotted to the students as per the rules of the University.
- ❑ The University reserves the right to cancel/refuse admission at any point of time if it is found that
 - a. minimum eligibility requirements are not fulfilled,
 - b. false documentation has been done, or, facts have been suppressed or distorted, or
 - c. any other similar valid reason is discovered.

It will be the responsibility of candidate to go through the rules carefully. Please note that a thorough checking of Application Form, minimum eligibility criteria, original documents in support of academic performance, categories claimed etc. will be done only at the time of counselling (if called for the same). If the candidate does not fulfill all requirements for admission, the candidature of the applicant is liable to be cancelled even at that stage.

Counselling for admission

The details of the counselling and admission procedure, category-wise cut-off list, schedule and dates, will be made available on the university website (igntu.ac.in) from time to time. Candidates must regularly visit the university website for updates. No separate letter by- Post shall be issued to eligible candidates due to time constraints.

The admission process shall begin soon after the declaration of results of Entrance Test/Preparation of Merit List. Admission shall be made by the Central Admission Committees. The Central Admission Committee shall evolve and adopt the appropriate method of counselling followed by on the spot allocation of seat, subject combination as per the seats available in that subject group combination (if any) strictly according to merit index. Candidates must produce all original documents such as High School Marks-sheet and Certificates of age, income, caste, intermediate (+2) or equivalent Marks-sheet and Certificate (if issued), 10+2+3 marks-sheet & degree, certificate of reservation, transfer certificate, migration certificate (if applicable) and Acknowledgement of Submitted Application Form and other required documents displayed at University website from time to time at the time of counselling, failing which their admission shall not be considered(unless permitted otherwise). No admissions shall be made on the basis of CONFIDENTIAL MARKS-SHEETS or PROVISIONAL RESULTS unless original mark-sheet after official declaration of the result is presented to the Admission Committee at the time of admission. It is mandatory to produce original certificates regarding Age, Caste, eligibility and income on the date given by the University. The candidates should pay the required fee on or within the prescribed date. Failure to pay the fees within the prescribed period will result-in cancellation of the allotted seat.

Reservation and other provisions for admission

Reservation

Reservation of seats shall be as per the norms of the Government of India / IGNTU.

Differently Abled Candidates

As per the provision under section 39 of the PWD Act 1995. 5% of seats are reserved for the Differently abled candidates. The Three categories of disability are: (a) Low-vision/blindness, (b) hearing impairment, and (c) locomotors disability/cerebral palsy. This provision is applicable if the candidate suffers from any of the listed disabilities to the extent of not less than 40% as certified by a medical authority as prescribes and explained in the said Act.

Supernumerary Seats

Two supernumerary seats are reserved for the students belonging to the State of Jammu & Kashmir under MHRD's special scholarship scheme per programme. One Supernumerary seat is reserved for students with certificates of NSS/NCC/Sports. The applicants seeking admission to any of the programme under the above quota have to see the details given.

N.C.C. Cadets

Candidates claiming reservation under the NCC quota should have the following NCC Certificates for admission -“A” Certificate for admission to programmes, “B” or “C” Certificate with A or B grade for admission to postgraduate, Pharmacy and B Ed Programmes.

N.S.S. Volunteers

NSS volunteers who have attended two ten-day Special Camps and one National Integration Camp or Republic Day Camp may claim reservation under Supernumerary NSS quota for admission.

Sports

Candidates seeking weightage for distinctions in sports must furnish along with their applications, self-attested photocopies of certificate/s in support of their claim, failing which no weightage would be considered.

Wards/dependents of Defense Personnel

One supernumerary seat is reserved for the wards/dependants of Defence Personnel. The candidates should enclose a copy of the certificate issued by a Competent Authority in support of their claim without which their claim shall not be considered. The candidates seeking admission under this category must take the entrance examination for admission and fulfil all other requirements of admission.

Admission to international students

- ❖ The University welcomes admission of international/Foreign/NRI students in all the Programmes. They can apply by sending a request through an e-mail and scanned copies of their mark sheets and other valid documents to the email ID of the Controller of Examinations i.e. coe@igntu.ac.in.
- ❖ There is fix separate quota in admissions for International Students. Further all such students have to satisfy conditions as laid down time to time by the University and Government of India. Separate fee structure shall be applicable for international students. The desirous candidates are

advised to contact with the University for knowing the detailed fee structure according to the Programmes.

- ❖ International students sponsored by the Government of India shall be eligible for admission as per the norms set in various schemes. All international student shall have to undergo mandatory medical tests for AIDS and other infectious diseases, within a week of their admission. Further, the admitted students have to produce student VISA within one month after the admission, failing so, their admission shall stand cancelled. Direct Admissions to Foreign Students under the DASA (Direct Admission of Students Abroad) Scheme of the Ministry of HRD shall be given on a supernumerary basis.

Students' recreational and cultural activities

The University organizes Student Sports and Cultural Fest once a year. The students

participate in various state and national level sports and cultural activities.

Sports activities

All sports activities in the University are conducted under the supervision of the University Sports Committee. The main function of the University Sports Committee is to select the best sportsmen to form the University team

and train them by organizing various sports camps in order to help them in participating enthusiastically in the AIU Sports and Inter University tournaments. Every year the University organizes intra-school sports fest.

Playground

The University conducts inter-departmental sports and other competitions at regular intervals. The Sports Complex is poised to be of national repute with modern art of indoor auditoriums, outdoor play grounds for cricket basketball, volley ball and other sports. At present, Cricket, Football, Volleyball and Kabaddi tournaments are

conducted at the proposed site.

The students of the University including tribal students show a great degree of interest in various sports activities such as Kabaddi, Volleyball, Football and Hockey. The University facilitates students to utilize leisure time in playing sports of their interests.

Swimming Pool

The University has planned to develop a swimming pool Complex subject to the supply of water from the nearby Johila Dam after the

successful implementation of water harvesting mechanism.

Gymnasiums

Three University Fitness Centres/Gymnasiums are located at the Girls' Hostel and at the Boys' Hostel with the latest equipment. These Fitness Centres are managed by a Committee consisting of teaching, non-teaching staff as well as students and scholars. Trained male and female physiotherapists are hired to provide essential tips to the users of the gymnasiums and provide continuous training to the students in the right use of equipment to get maximum benefits of physical fitness. The Committee controls the

management and maintenance of the gymnasium with the help of experts.

A membership form has been customized for the users and they can submit the form with a prescribed fee to become the member of the Gymnasium. The form is accepted only if accompanied by the declaration certificate from the University Medical Officers with an endorsement of medical fitness of the users.

The University constructed a closed gymnasium for girls with well advance

gymnastic equipment to build strong physic.

Campus facilities

CENTRAL LIBRARY

Library is a knowledge resource centre which has a good collection of texts as well as reference resources to meet the needs of the faculty and students. This Library is comparable to any other well established University Library in the country in respect of its services and collection. On 19th January 2015 the Library moved into the new building spread in 4 floors including basement. The total carpet area of the Library is

3187.97 sq. mts. An immediate step was taken to develop infrastructure facilities. An amount of more than Rs. 1.00 core has been spent in purchasing furniture and equipment. Library is more focused on creating and providing a comfortable and user friendly environment that enables learning and advancement of knowledge.

NETWORKING FACILITY

The aim of the Computer Centre is to enable students to make use of modern technology to enhance their learning skills computer, software and new educational assets that will allow the students to keep pace with the fast-evolving technological era. The Computer Centre offers access to a variety of computing resources for

teaching, learning, and research and also to access the Internet, Campus Network and Wi-Fi on and off campus. A good number of high level computers are available for independent study and learning, with support from efficient technical staff.

HOSTEL FACILITY

Keeping in view, the practical problems of accessibility due to remote locations, the University has given much importance to building hostels for boys and girls with a view to increase the attendance. The Narmada Girls' hostel became functional in 2012 with a provision of 200 beds with 24 hrs. generator backup and the facilities like common room, dining hall, badminton hall, volleyball court,

yoga & meditation hall. The Sone Boy's hostel became functional in 2013 with the provision of 200 beds with 24 hrs. generator backup and the facilities like common room, dining hall, badminton and volleyball court and yoga & meditation room. The University has built two mega hostels for the students with a maximum capacity of 750 beds with built-up areas of 24240 sq. metres for boys and girls.

Each room is allotted on shared basis and is well furnished with cupboards, cots, reading tables, chairs and book shelves. Washrooms, toilets and bathrooms are attached to each block. They have three-storied with four

blocks on each floor.

The University has established cafeteria at five different vantage points such as administrative building, academic building, hostels and temporary academic block.

HEALTH CARE FACILITY

The University Primary Health Centre provides emergency services. The health care of all the students, faculty members, and non-teaching staff of the University is ensured by a regular senior doctor available on the campus with supporting staff including dresser, nurse and

pharmacist. The facilities provided include In-patient ward (02), IV drip facility, blood test, urine test, and blood pressure test. For emergency services, there is a 24x7 ambulance facility available on the campus.

POST OFFICE FACILITY

The India Post has established a Sub Post Office on the University campus. IGNTU has thereby gained its own identity in the geographical map of India by the PIN Code 484887. The IGNTU Sub Post Office provides all normal services which are available everywhere such as Savings Bank account, Recurring Deposit account, Speed Post, Regd Post, eMO, iMO, PLI/ RPLI, IMT,

MO Videsh, ePayment, and Postal Orders/ NSC/ KVP.

For the students, the Post Office offers the following services: Saving Bank (with Cheque Book and ATM card facility): Recurring Deposit Account (with a minimum of Rs. 50): Philately or Stamp Collection (King of hobbies): Post Crossing (special cards): and ePost.

CANTEEN FACILITY

The University has a number of canteens. The food provided at the canteens is a mix of south Indian and north Indian dishes. The University

ensures proper hygiene, freshness of the food, and nominal rates at the respective canteens.

SHOPPING COMPLEX

The University has on campus facilities such as hair styling salon, stationery shop, grocery shop, dairy shop, fruits & vegetables shop and bakery shop. The stationery shop, apart from selling regular stationery items, provides photocopying and printing facilities. The bakery shop, which

provides fresh bakery items, is one of the popular destinations for the student community. One book stall-cum-stationary shop is located in the shopping complex on the campus to meet the requirements of books and stationary items. In addition, one departmental store and electronic store are running at the shopping complex.

TRANSPORTATION FACILITY

Given the location as constraint for the students to come to the University on their own, the University has been providing bus services to the students from nearby towns, situated above 25 km distance, such as Pendra Road, Gaurella, Karanjia and Rajendra Gram, apart from buses plying from Amarkantak being the Official Headquarters of the University. The University

has hired seven buses with each 52-sitting capacity through proper tendering processes. The University has been operating bus services as per the approved schedule. One teacher and an officer with the help of Proctorial Board are overseeing the discipline and smooth operation of buses. A nominal amount per month towards fee is charged from the students collected quarterly through Challan.

SECURITY

The safety of the students on the campus is being taken care of by the campus security agency. The security personnel are kept vigilant

to prevent the occurrence of any untoward incident to the student community.

CENTRAL FACILITIES

Health Centre and Ambulance Facility

A well-equipped Ambulance (donated by Central Bank of India) is pressed into service for

free of cost for staff and students to take care of medical emergency situations.

BANK, SHOPPING COMPLEX ,ETC.

The University is maintaining its banking transactions with nationalized banks, i.e., State Bank of India, Central Bank of India and Canara Bank located at Amarkantak and in the University

Campus to transfer of salary and term deposits. Two ATMs of Central Bank of India and Canara Bank are also functioning on the campus.

POWER HOUSE

In order to avoid the chance of strong wind uprooting the electric poles and the wires of high tension line along with sub connections, electricity is supplied through underground cabling to all the establishments including hostels and staff quarters. At present, there are

six service stations to control the distribution of power supply from the power houses. All the substations are barricaded and a covered with roofs. The locations of all substations are far away from habitational areas.

NCC

NCC wing conducted parades and other drills as per the provisions for appropriate certificates. Cadets are encouraged to participate in CATC and other camps. The cadets Drill Competition, Cross Country, Run, Speech Competition and Weapon

Training are arranged in CATC Camp. The Wing planted 200 saplings in the University campus during the session. The cadets actively participated in all University Programme.

NSS

National Service Scheme was established in July 2014 in IGNTU. Numerous activities have been carried out by the volunteers of NSS on the occasion of Independence Day, Sadbhavna Diwas, NSS Foundation Day, and

Gandhi Jayanti, Sardar Patel anniversary Day / Unity Day, World Aids Day, World Human Rights Day, Vivekanand Day/Youth Day/YuwaDiwas and Republic Day. NSS Volunteers were also actively engaged in NSS Camps.

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

As per UGC Regulations, 2009 on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions under para 6.3 (a & c), an Anti-Ragging Committee as well as an Anti-Ragging Squad have been constituted in the IGNTU Amarkantak (M.P.)

STUDENTS' MENTORING AND SUPPORT

Dean Student's Welfare acts as a mentor in supporting the students in pursuing studies without any hassle. Matters relating to medical facilities, insurance, hostel facilities, cultural festivals, scholarships, financial assistance and

Apart from the department-wise placement cell, there is a Placement Coordinator at the University level

All professional Programme are associated with industries for learning the recent trends of business and inducting students for internship or on the job training.
